Highlights: Pong Dueat Hot Spring / Pai Canyon / Tha Pai Memorial Bridge / Wat Phra That Mae Yen Temple (Lunch)

Renowned as the largest geyser hot spring in the region, Pong Dueat offers a geothermal spectacle. Imagine a large pool of steaming water, periodically erupting with reaching 1-2 meters high, similar underground counterparts. The surrounding area is adorned with four sizeable ponds, along with a scattering of smaller ones. Be aware that the geothermal nature of the spring results in scorching underground reaching staggering 170-200 temperatures, а dearees Celsius. Thankfully, the surface water cools considerably, settling at a more manageable 90-100 degrees Celsius. The area is characterized by a distinct sulfurous scent, natural byproduct of the geothermal activity. But Pong Dueat offers more than just a hot soak. Immerse yourself in the surrounding jungle via a meticulously designed 1.5kilometer nature trail. This circular path winds through the lush forest, offering a chance to admire towering trees, delicate ferns, and vibrant moss carpeting the ground. The trail provides a shortcut, eliminating the need to retrace your steps, and features a long bridge for ease of navigation. Informative signage accompanies you along the way, unveiling the secrets of Pong Dueat Hot Spring and the diverse plant life that thrives in this unique ecosystem. This nature trail is the perfect complement to experiencing the geothermal marvel of Pong Dueat.

Lunch at the restaurant.

Leaving the geothermal wonders behind, we embark on a scenic drive along a historical World War II road. As we navigate the winding curves that climb and descend through

the hills, breathtaking vistas of the majestic mountains will unfold before you. Our next stop is Pai Canyon, also known as Kong Lan in Thai. This awe-inspiring natural formation is a testament to the relentless power of nature. Imagine the subsidence of soil on a once-towering mountain, sculpted by relentless wind and rain into a dramatic landscape. Deep trenches resembling cliffs snake through the area, punctuated by sections that jut out like long, winding ridges. This captivating interplay of erosion has resulted in a vast, continuous area exceeding 3 acres. The surrounding landscape of Pai Canyon is a tapestry of diverse vegetation, forming a mixed deciduous forest. Trails meander along these ridges, offering a thrilling yet slightly challenging experience due to their narrow and sometimes steep nature. As you navigate these paths, peer down into the lush forests and deep chasms that lie below, creating a sense of adventure. But the true magic of Pai Canyon unfolds at the summit. Here, you'll be rewarded with a panoramic vista unlike any other. Witness the charming villages and farms nestled amidst the foothills, all framed by the majestic backdrop of the soaring mountains. This breathtaking panorama is a testament to the harmonious blend of nature's raw beauty and human habitation.

Our historical expedition continues with a visit to the Memorial Bridge. This bridge, built during World War II when Japan occupied Thailand, served a strategic purpose similar to the infamous Kwai River Bridge. It was intended as a route to transport troops and weaponry into Myanmar. While the bridge was once used by locals, a modern bridge now serves that function. However, the weathered Memorial Bridge stands preserved, a powerful symbol of the region's wartime past. It's a popular spot for tourists to take photos, a tangible reminder of the area's history. Our final stop is Wat Phra That Mae Yen Temple, perched majestically atop a hill in Mae Yen village. Ascend the steps and be rewarded with a panoramic vista that will leave you speechless. Take in the beauty of Pai sprawled out before you, a tapestry of nature and civilization. But the true magic unfolds at sunset. Witness the breathtaking spectacle as the sun dips below the horizon, casting a glow on the intricate mountain ranges. unforgettable scene, a perfect blend of nature's grandeur and the serenity of the temple, will leave an everlasting impression. After a day filled with exploring the natural wonders and rich history of Pai, we'll return to Chiang Mai in the evening, dropping you off comfortably at your accommodation. This marks the end of our captivating journey through Northern Thailand.
