DAY 02 Chiang Mai Sightseeing: Wat Prathat Doi Suthep Temple / Bhubing Palace / Hmong Village Doi Pui / Wat Chedi Luang Temple (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

Breakfast at the hotel.

08:30AM. Pick up from the hotel.

On the second day of your family trip in Chiang Mai, you embark on a journey to explore some of the city's most significant and beautiful landmarks. Your first stop is Wat Phra That Doi Suthep Temple, which is located on Doi Suthep Mountain. Wat Phra That Doi Suthep Temple is an iconic symbol of Chiang Mai and one of the most sacred sites in Northern Thailand. Legend has it that the temple was founded in 1383 with the intention of enshrining a relic of the Lord Buddha. Today, it remains an essential pilgrimage site for both locals and visitors seeking blessings and tranquility. Continuing your journey, you visit Doi Pui Village, a Hmong hill tribe village situated in the Doi Suthep Pui National Park area. The village boasts

The village also offers a viewpoint from where you can marvel at the intricate beauty of the surrounding mountains.

Next, you visit Wat Chedi Luang Worawihan temple, a stunning and historic temple that is situated in the middle of Chiang Mai's old city. After immersing yourselves in the rich culture of the Lahu tribe, you continue your journey to Mae Hong Son. Upon arriving in Mae Hong Son, you transfer to your hotel and

DAY 06 Mae Hong Son Sightseeing: Wat Phra That Doi Kong Mu Temple / Wat Chong Kham and Wat Chong Klang Temples / Ban Rak Thai Chinese Village / Ban Ruam Thai Shan Village (Pang Oung) / Su Tong Pae Bamboo Bridge (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

08:30AM. Pick up from the hotel.

On the sixth day of your family trip in Mae Hong Son, you continue your exploration of the region's temples, natural wonders, and charming villages. Your first stop is Wat Phra That Doi Kong Mu temple, the most important place of worship in Mae Hong Son. Situated on the top of Kong Mu Mountain, the temple boasts two pagodas of different sizes. These old temples feature beautiful Burmese-style edifices and house the revered Buddha image, Luang Paw To. Wat Chong Klang has an impressive display of Burmese wood carving dolls and large glass paintings depicting Buddhist history.

Continuing your journey, you visit the Su Tong Pae Bridge, the longest bamboo bridge in Thailand. This bridge connects Suan Tham Phusama Temple and Kung Mai Sak village, crossing over paddy fields and canals. The bridge offers a classic and unique beauty, particularly during the rainy season when the surrounding fields are lush green, and the grains shimmer in golden hues during the winter. The bridge is a significant and memorable sight for visitors, providing a wonderful experience of walking amidst the verdant landscape.

Afterwards, you head to Baan Rak Thai village, situated near the border between Thailand and Myanmar. This village was established by the Yunnan Chinese people, specifically the former military of the Chinese Nationalist 93rd division, or "Kuomintang," who sought refuge here during the communist regime's revolution and innovation. The village's stunning

scenery, with its beautiful mountains, lakes, and colorful shrubbery, leaves tourists amazed and captivated. You'll also have the opportunity to taste delicious Yunnan cuisine, including the renowned Chinese tea honored as the best quality tea in Mae Hong Son province.

Next, you admire the tranquil atmosphere of Baan Ruam Thai, also known as Pang Oung, a Shan village nestled among rugged mountain ranges. The village's big lake, surrounded by pine forests and colorful winter flowers, has earned it the nickname "Switzerland in Thailand." The breathtaking scenery, including fog floating above the lake in the morning, invites visitors to revel in the beauty of nature year-round. After a day filled with cultural encounters, natural splendor, and picturesque villages, you return to your accommodation for another night in Mae Hong Son. DAY 07 Mae Hong Son - Chiang Mai: Doi Inthanon National Park / Royal Pagodas / The Royal Agricultural Station Inthanon / Wachiratharn Waterfall (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

On the seventh day of your family trip, you leave Mae Hong Son and head to the renowned Doi Inthanon National Park. The journey takes you through winding roads, providing breathtaking views of the beautiful mountains and landscapes. As you arrive at Doi Inthanon, you'll be captivated by the majesty of the highest peak in Thailand, standing at an impressive altitude of 2,565 meters above sea level. Doi Inthanon is a part of the Thanon Thongchai Mountain range, which stretches across several countries, including Nepal, Bhutan, and Myanmar, and boasts a diverse and abundant range of climates and forests. The park offers an array of experiences, from exploring rain forests to pine forests and mixed forests at different heights. At the peak, you'll be rewarded with stunning panoramic views, making it a must-visit destination for travelers from all over the world who are drawn to the cool weather, beautiful scenery, and abundant forest.

Next, you visit the Twin Royal Pagodas, Napamethanidol, and Napapolpumisiri, perched atop a high hill in Doi Inthanon

National Park. These pagodas were created as a collaboration between the Air Force and people from all over Thailand to honor the 60th anniversary of His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej Rama 9 in 1987 and to commemorate the auspicious 5th anniversary of Her Majesty Queen Sirikit on her birthday, August 12, 1992. The pagodas are surrounded by beautifully landscaped winter flower gardens and a variety of plants, offering a serene and picturesque atmosphere. The cool weather throughout the year contributes to the charm of this place, making it one of the most stunning viewpoints in Chiang Mai.

Lunch at the restaurant.

Continuing your exploration, you visit Wachirathan Waterfall, an awe-inspiring single-tiered waterfall with a height of 70 meters. This majestic waterfall is considered one of the most beautiful in Thailand, with water flowing throughout the year. Your next stop is the Royal Agricultural Station Inthanon, a research station focusing on winter plants. The station conducts research on flowers, ornamental plants, vegetables, fruits, and highland fisheries, with a focus on promoting fundamental development, social development, and forest watershed conservation. The project also benefits hill tribe farmers' families in the surrounding villages, generating income and supporting their livelihoods. After your visit to the Royal Agricultural Station Inthanon, you'll continue your journey back to Chiang Mai. Arriving in the city, you'll be transferred to your hotel for your last overnight stay. Take this time to relax and reflect on the wonderful memories made during your adventurous and enriching family trip.
