DAY 03 Chiang Mai - Mae Hong Son: Doi Inthanon National Park / Grand Pagodas / The Royal Agricultural Station Inthanon / Wachiratharn Waterfall (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

Embark on an enchanting journey from Chiang Mai to the breathtaking Doi Inthanon National Park, a land of natural wonders and cultural gems. Begin your adventure at the Royal Agricultural Station Inthanon, a vibrant research station dedicated to winter plants. Marvel at the colorful flower plots, diverse vegetables, and an array of fruits. This station not only conducts essential research on various agricultural aspects, including flowers, ornamental plants, vegetables, fruits, and highland fisheries but also focuses on sharing research findings to promote sustainable development, social progress, and forest watershed conservation. The project plays a crucial role in supporting hill tribe farmers' families in the neighboring villages by generating income and fostering community development.

Discover the magnificent allure of Wachirathan Waterfall, an impressive natural wonder that stands tall and majestic as one of Thailand's most beautiful waterfalls, gracing the landscape with its year-round flowing waters. With its towering height reaching an impressive 70

meters, this single-tiered cascade captivates all who lay eyes upon it. The waterfall's charm is further enhanced during the rainy season when sun-kissed water droplets scatter through the air, giving rise to enchanting rainbows that adorn the surroundings of Wachirathan Waterfall. This mesmerizing phenomenon adds a touch of wonder and magic, elevating the waterfall's beauty to even greater heights. Wachirathan Waterfall's grandeur and unyielding flow, regardless of the season, make it a captivating destination for nature lovers and adventurers alike. The pagodas are surrounded by enchanting winter flower gardens and a diverse array of plants. The area's cool climate offers a refreshing ambiance throughout the year, and the panoramic views from this vantage point are considered among the most splendid in Chiang Mai.

Venture to Doi Inthanon, Thailand's highest peak towering at an impressive altitude of 2,565 meters above sea level. This majestic mountain is part of the vast Thanon Thongchai Mountain range, which stretches across multiple countries, including Nepal, Bhutan, and Myanmar. The mountain boasts a rich variety of climates and forests, with opportunities to experience rainforests, pine forests, and mixed forests at different elevations. At the summit, visitors will be rewarded with breathtaking panoramic vistas. The allure of Doi Inthanon lies not only in its cool weather and scenic splendor but also in the abundance of its diverse forest ecosystem, attracting travelers from all corners of the globe. DAY 04 Mae Hong Son Sightseeing: Wat Phra That Doi Kong Mu Temple / Wat Chong Kham and Wat Chong Klang Temples / Su Tong Pae Bamboo Bridge / Ban Ruam Thai (Pang Oung) / Ban Rak Thai village (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

Begin your exploration with a visit to Wat Phra That Doi Kong Mu temple, a revered place of worship atop Kong Mu Mountain. This sacred site is graced by two magnificent pagodas, one constructed by "Chong Thong Su" in 1860 and the other by "Phraya Singhanatracha" in 1874. From this hilltop temple, behold the breathtaking beauty of the town, nestled amidst picturesque mountains and valleys. Continuing your temple tour, visit Wat Chong Kham and Wat Chong Klang, two ancient temples standing side by side near a large swamp. Admire their exquisite Burmese-style architecture and the revered Buddha image (Luang Paw To). In Wat Chong Klang, be captivated by an array of intricate Burmese wood carving dolls and grand glass paintings that depict Buddhist history.

Venture to the remarkable Su Tong Pae Bridge, an architectural marvel and the longest bamboo bridge in all of Thailand. This stunning bridge gracefully connects Suan Tham Phusama Temple to the charming Kung Mai Sak village. As you traverse this classic bamboo bridge, you'll be greeted by the breathtaking sight of emerald paddy fields and tranquil canals stretching into the distance. Embark on an enriching journey from Mae Hong Son to Pang Mapha District, where captivating experiences await in Ban Ja Bo Village, a serene Lahu hill tribe settlement perched on a ridge amidst breathtaking mountain vistas. The Lahu people have a fascinating history, originating from Tibet and later migrating to the south of China and the northeast of Myanmar over the course of centuries. Eventually, they settled in the northern regions of Thailand. Embracing a simple way of life, the Lahu prefer to build their villages on high lands, away from chaos. They hold strong beliefs in spirit worship and maintain a harmonious relationship with nature. Agriculture, including rice farming and corn planting, forms the core of their livelihood, along with animal husbandry and traditional hunting. Upon arriving at Ban Ja Bo Village, visitors are warmly greeted by the friendly Lahu community, known for their adaptability and open-heartedness towards people from different cultures and languages. Embrace the tranquil surroundings and learn about the tribe's customs and heritage, making for a truly enriching experience.

Lunch at the restaurant.

The lively walking street comes alive from 5 PM until midnight, providing a delightful evening experience. DAY 06 Pai Sightseeing: Santichon Chinese Village / Yun Lai Viewpoint / Wat Phra That Mae Yen Temple / Memorial Bridge / Pai Canyon / Khokuso Bamboo Bridge (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

Breakfast at the hotel.

08:30AM. Pick up from the hotel.

Embark on a captivating journey through Pai, exploring its unique villages, stunning viewpoints, historical sites, and natural wonders. First, visit Santichon village, a charming settlement belonging to Yunnan Chinese people who migrated from China long ago. Despite the passage of time, the village remains a treasure trove of Yunnan Chinese culture, traditions, and way of life. The houses, decorations, and overall environment still exude the distinct Yunnan Chinese style, offering a fascinating glimpse into their heritage. Nearby, don't miss the Yun Lai viewpoint, a breathtaking spot that provides panoramic views of Pai city enveloped by lush paddy fields and rugged mountain ranges. The sight of a sea of mist blanketing the area during both winter and the rainy season is truly enchanting. Be sure to catch the spectacular sunrise at the viewpoint, an awe-inspiring moment that will etch a lasting memory in your heart.

Next, visit Wat Phra That Mae Yen Temple, perched atop a high hill in Mae Yen village. From this vantage point, indulge in the mesmerizing landscape that stretches across Pai city. Sunrise and sunset moments are especially magical, as the golden sunlight bathes the horizon, accentuating the intricate beauty of the surrounding mountain ranges.

Explore the historical significance of the Memorial Bridge, constructed during World War II when Japan was a significant presence in Thailand. This bridge served as a route for transporting troops and arms into Myanmar, akin to the renowned Kwai River Bridge. While a new bridge has replaced it for modern transportation, the Memorial Bridge stands as a poignant reminder of the area's history. A visit to Pai Canyon, also known as Kong Lan, promises to leave you in awe. This natural attraction is formed by the subsidence of soil on high mountains, sculpted by wind and rain into deep trenches and winding ridge-like

formations spanning over 3 acres. As you traverse the narrow, steep trails along the ridges, you'll be rewarded with stunning views of the surrounding mixed deciduous forest, villages, and farms below.

Lastly, explore the Merit Bridge, known as "Khokuso," a symbolic bridge built by the villagers. This winding bamboo bridge connects Pambok village and Huai Khai Khiri temple, serving as a convenient passage for monks to receive alms without disturbing the villagers' agricultural crops. Besides its practical purpose, the bridge offers both tourists and villagers the chance to make merit and revel in the beauty of the forest, mountains, and rice fields along the way. After a day filled with cultural discoveries and natural splendors, spend the night in Pai, cherishing the memories of this enriching and captivating journey.

DAY 07 Pai - Ban Tha Ton Village: Pong Dued Hot Spring / Mork Fah Waterfall / Wat Ban Den Temple / Hinoki Land / Ban Tha Ton (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

Breakfast at the hotel.

08:00AM. Pick up from the hotel.

Embark on a mesmerizing journey from Pai to Mae Taeng District, where a plethora of natural wonders, cultural delights, and architectural marvels await. First, visit the Pong Dueat Hot Springs, a grand geyser-like hot spring with steam rising regularly. This underground hot spring boasts a temperature between 170-200 degrees Celsius, while the surface water hovers around 90-100 degrees Celsius, emitting a constant aroma of sulfur. Surrounding the hot springs is a lush jungle, offering a nature study route spanning approximately 1.5 km. This scenic path leads you through towering trees, ferns, and moss, presenting a captivating journey that forms a circular loop and crosses a long bridge. Along the way, informative signboards share insights about Pong Dueat Hot Springs and the plants you encounter, adding to the enriching experience.

Next, venture to Mork Fah Waterfall, nestled within Doi Suthep-Pui National Park. This single-tiered waterfall may not be the largest, but its water flows throughout the year. Streams from the dense forest converge, forming two branches that cascade gracefully into rocky cliffs below. Surrounded by abundant trees and moss and fern-covered plants, the waterfall creates a magical scene when sunlight pierces through, reflecting off the cascading waters, forming a sparkling rainbow. In autumn,

the atmosphere takes on a different charm, and in the rainy season, the waterfall's strength intensifies, enveloping the area in a magnificent display of power and beauty.

Lunch at the restaurant.

Continue your exploration by visiting Wat Ban Den Temple, also known as Wat Den Sari Sri Muang Kaen, located in Inthakin Sub-District. The temple's name is derived from the auspicious "Sari Tree" or Bodhi tree found within its grounds. As it sits within the ancient city of Muang Kaen, the locals affectionately refer to it as "Wat Den Sari Sri Muang Kaen." This hilltop temple offers breathtaking views of the surrounding landscape and features exquisite Thai Lanna architecture in its various buildings, including the ubosot, tripitaka hall, drum tower, Inthakin pole sanctuary, Lanna cubicle golden teak, and pagoda.

Visit Hinoki Land, a unique attraction that serves as Thailand's first and only hinoki wood kingdom, meticulously curated to showcase Japanese art, culture, and architecture. Spread across an 83-rai area, Hinoki Land transports visitors to a beautiful Japanese atmosphere. Adorned with Japanese-style buildings, a grand red lantern arch at the entrance symbolizing "good luck," and a tunnel lined with 88 pairs of torii gates leading to the majestic Hinoki Castle inspired by Kinkakuji Castle in Kyoto, this destination offers an enchanting Japanese experience amidst mountainous and forested surroundings.

Conclude your day's journey in Ban Tha Ton Village, a charming border village adjacent to Myanmar in Mae Ai District, Chiang Mai Province. The village is embraced by picturesque mountains and a tranquil river, boasting a cool climate throughout the year. Immersed in the cultural diversity of the multi-ethnic hill tribe people living in the vicinity, visitors will relish the opportunity to experience their customs and traditions fully. A highlight of the visit is Wat Tha Ton Temple, beautifully perched on a hillside with a nine-layered base, each tier housing sacred religious places and culminating in the highest peak housing "Phra Borommathat Ratchamangkalachan Samanchan" or "Phra Chedi Kaew." From every peak, you'll enjoy breathtaking views of Ban Tha Ton Village, Mae Ai District, and the surrounding mountains. As the day draws to a close, savor the captivating experiences of the journey and spend the

night in Ban Tha Ton Village, cherishing the beauty and serenity of this charming borderland retreat.

DAY 08 Ban Tha Ton - Chiang Rai: Roi Jai Rak Project / Akha hill tribe Village / Doi Mae Salong / Wat Huay Pla Kang Temple (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

Breakfast at the hotel.

08:30AM. Pick up from the hotel.

Embark on an enriching journey to Ban Huai San Village in Mae Ai District, Chiang Mai Province, where cultural discoveries, picturesque landscapes, and vibrant markets await. Begin your visit at the Roi Jai Rak Project, a thoughtful initiative managed by the Mae Fah Luang Foundation under the Royal Patronage of His Majesty the King. The project's main goal is to enhance the quality of life for the local hill tribe communities by creating employment opportunities and generating income. The project encompasses Suan Roi Jai Rak, a delightful garden plantation showcasing a variety of winter flowers and vegetables for visitors to admire. Additionally, explore Kad Luang Roi Jai Rak, a market where villagers present high-quality produce, including fresh vegetables, fruits, and flowers, along with intricate handicrafts for tourists to peruse and purchase.

Next, immerse yourself in the fascinating culture, traditions, and lifestyle of the Akha hill tribe. Originally from southern China, the Akha people have migrated and established villages in the north of Myanmar and, eventually, settled in the north of Thailand over the past century. These vibrant communities prefer high-altitude living, typically residing at around 1,000 meters above sea level. Most Akha houses are built on the ground, featuring thatched roofs and bamboo walls, often situated on flat areas along mountain ridges. Agriculture, including crop cultivation and livestock rearing, forms the backbone of their economy. Household industries such as sewing, embroidery, and silverware crafting also contribute to their livelihood. Admire the Akha women's colorful dresses adorned with eye-catching silverware and multicolored beads, a tribal attire as captivating as that of other northern Thai tribes.

Lunch at the restaurant.

Venture to Doi Mae Salong, renowned for cultivating excellent tea and surrounded by breathtaking beauty. Green terraced tea plantations spread across the area, offering a serene and tranquil atmosphere for visitors to

enjoy. Doi Mae Salong is a Chinese Yunnan village, whose residents immigrated to Thailand decades ago due to political changes in China. Scattered settlements emerged in northern Thailand in 1961, and the Thai government officially welcomed Chinese immigrants to settle in Thailand in 1972. Agriculture, particularly tea and various fruits and vegetables, became their primary occupation. Apart from the scenic terraced tea plantations and mountain vistas, the village exudes an ambiance reminiscent of a Chinese village in southern China.

Continue your journey to Chiang Rai to visit the impressive Wat Huay Pla Kang Temple. Perched atop a small hill, the temple boasts stunning views of its surroundings. Notably, the temple's 9-storey, 12-sided chedi captivates with its unique shape adorned with intricate Chinese and Lanna arts. The chedi's red roof is flanked by two majestic dragon statues, leading visitors up the stairs to its peak. Inside the chedi, an exquisite large sandalwood statue of the Goddess Guan Yin Bodhisattva graces the space. The temple also features a 69-meter-tall statue of Guan Yin Bodhisattva, nearly the height of a 25-storey building, with an elevator system providing easy access for tourists to enjoy breathtaking views of Chiang Rai. As the day comes to an end, find comfort and rest in Chiang Rai, reflecting on the captivating experiences of the journey and the beauty of the destinations explored.

DAY 09 Chiang Rai Sightseeing: Doi Tung Palace and Mae Fah Luang Garden / Mae Sai / Golden Triangle / Mekong River Cruise / Chiang Rai Night Bazaar (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

08:30AM. Pick up from the hotel.

Embark on an enchanting journey to Mae Fah Luang District, where the captivating Doi Tung Palace and Mae Fah Luang Garden await. These popular attractions in Chiang Rai draw tourists year-round with their mesmerizing displays of beautifully lined flowers, rotating and changing with the seasons to showcase Mae Fah Luang Garden's beauty in all its glory. Admire the exquisite Lanna-style art and architecture of Doi Tung Palace, adding to the charm of the surroundings.

Continue your adventure to Mae Sai District, Thailand's northernmost region, which shares a border with Myanmar's Tachilek province, connected by the Mae Sai River and a

bridge linking the two cities. From the Thai side, you'll catch a glimpse of Myanmar, and a visit to Mae Sai Market, a renowned border market, is a must. The bustling marketplace is a shopper's paradise, offering an assortment of goods at affordable prices, including electrical appliances, local crafts, herbs, wicker products, and delectable dry foods.

Lunch at the restaurant.

Continuing the journey, venture to the historic Golden Triangle at Sop Ruak Village, Chiang Saen District, where the Mekong River demarcates the border between Thailand and Laos, while the Ruak River separates Thailand and Myanmar. From this vantage point, tourists can witness the clear borders of Myanmar and Laos, and here lies the intriguing past of the Golden Triangle. In times gone by, the region comprising the junction of these three countries was known for its opium cultivation, making it the epicenter of opium production worldwide. The name "Golden Triangle" originated from the riches derived from trading raw opium, often referred to as "black gold." However, as the times changed, opium cultivation and trade have ceased, leaving behind fascinating legends and historical stories. Upon delving into the past of the Golden Triangle, visitors can explore the awe-inspiring Golden Triangle Buddha. This remarkable statue, crafted from bronze and gilded with topaz, stands with a weight of up to 69 tons, a lap width of 10 meters, and a soaring height of 15 meters. The Golden Triangle Buddha was erected to replace the former Buddha image that had once been submerged in the waters of the Mekong River. Today, it stands majestically enshrined outdoors on the Mekong River's shore, serving as a symbol of peace and serenity in this historically significant area.

Embark on a serene cruise along the Mekong River, appreciating the beauty of nature and the unique ways of life of the riverbank communities. The Mekong River is a vital waterway that originates in the Tibetan Plateau and meanders through China, Laos, Myanmar, and Thailand, before emptying into the South China Sea. It has long sustained the livelihoods and cultures of the people living along its banks, connecting diverse communities and fostering economic and cultural ties. End the day at Chiang Rai Night Bazaar, a bustling night market drawing Thai and international visitors alike. The bazaar showcases a plethora of hill tribe handicrafts, local products, clothing, accessories, and home furnishings. Indulge in a variety of delectable food and beverages while enjoying folk cultural activities and performances
