Embrace the refreshing embrace of nature at Pha Suea Waterfall, a cascading wonder with six distinct levels. Considered one of the most stunning waterfalls in the region, it offers invigorating walks along the river path, allowing you to witness its beauty from various angles. Plan your visit between July and October to experience Pha

Suea in all its glory. Step into a unique cultural haven at Baan Rak Thai village, nestled near the Thai-Myanmar border. This settlement, established by former Chinese Nationalist soldiers, boasts stunning scenery, serene lakes, and vibrant shrubbery. Immerse yourself in the aroma of tea plantations, indulge in delicious Yunnan cuisine, and savor the distinct flavor of the region's prized tea.
