On the fifth day of your family trip, you start with a visit to Wat Phra That Doi Kong Mu temple, an essential place of worship in Mae Hong Son. Perched on top of Kong Mu Mountain, the temple comprises two pagodas of different sizes. The larger one was built by Chong Thong Su, a Shan merchant in 1860, while the smaller one was constructed by Phraya Singhanatracha the first ruler of Mae Hong Son, in 1874. The hilltop location offers panoramic views of the town, surrounded by the enchanting beauty of mountains and valleys. Next, you explore two more temples in the area, Wat Chong Kham, and Wat Chong Klang, both located near the big swamp. These temples feature stunning Burmese-style architecture and house the revered Buddha image, Luang Paw To. Wat Chong Klang boasts an impressive display of Burmese wood carving dolls and large glass paintings depicting Buddhist history.

Continuing your journey, you will visit the Su Tong Pe Bridge, Thailand's longest bamboo bridge. Stretching over 500 meters, it connects Suan Tham Phusama Temple with Kung Mai Sak Village. This locally crafted bamboo marvel offers panoramic views of rice paddies and serene canals, reflecting the ingenuity of local artisans. The bridge is particularly enchanting during the rainy season, when golden rice fields, lush greenery, and distant mountains create a breathtaking backdrop. Farmers working in the fields add a touch of rural charm, while the gentle sway of bamboo and rustling leaves create a tranquil ambiance. Each season brings its own beauty: earthy tones in the dry season and shimmering golden fields under clear skies in winter. No matter the time of year, the Su Tong Pe Bridge promises a unique and unforgettable experience.

From the Su Tong Pe Bridge, head to Baan Rak Thai, also known as Mae Aw, a captivating village with a distinct blend of Thai and Chinese cultures. This hidden paradise is situated near the border with Myanmar, surrounded by lush tea plantations and misty hills, creating a serene and tranquil atmosphere. Reaching Doi Inthanon, you stand atop the highest peak in Thailand, soaring at an impressive altitude of 2,565 meters above sea level. Doi Inthanon is part of the Thanon Thongchai Mountain range, which stretches from the Himalayas, encompassing countries such as Nepal, Bhutan, and Myanmar. The diversity of climate and forest in the area allows you to experience rainforests, pine forests, and mixed forests at varying elevations. At the peak, you are rewarded with a breathtaking panoramic view that showcases the beauty of the surrounding landscape. The cool weather, picturesque scenery, and lush forests make Doi Inthanon a charming destination that attracts visitors from all over the world.

Next, visit the Twin Royal Pagodas, Napamethanidol and Napapolpumisiri, situated atop a high hill in Doi Inthanon National Park. Phra Mahathat Napamethanidol was built to honor and pay homage to Phra Bat Somdet Phra Paraminthra Maha Bhumibol Adulyadej Rama IX during the auspicious celebration of His Majesty the King's 5th cycle birthday in 1987. Similarly, Phra Mahathat Naphaphonphumisiri was constructed as an offering to Her Majesty Queen Sirikit during the celebrations of Her Majesty the Queen's 5th cycle birthday in 1992. The surroundings of the pagodas are adorned with winter flower gardens and various plants, adding to the beauty of the area. The cool weather prevailing throughout the year provides a comfortable ambiance, and the panoramic views from this vantage point are considered some of the most beautiful in Chiang Mai.

Lunch at the restaurant.

Continuing your exploration, you visit Wachirathan Waterfall, one of Thailand's most awe-inspiring natural wonders. Nestled in the heart of Doi Inthanon National Park, this 70-meter-high cascade presents a mesmerizing spectacle that never fails to enchant its visitors. Flowing robustly year-round, the waterfall guarantees a dazzling display regardless of the season. During the rainy months, the scene becomes even more magical as vibrant rainbows often appear, arcing across the mist-filled air and adding a fairytale-like charm to the setting. The water tumbles dramatically down a rugged cliff, creating a refreshing mist that cools the surrounding air and provides a welcome retreat on warm days. The ambiance around Wachirathan is both serene and invigorating, enhanced by the lush, green forest that envelops the area. Towering trees, vibrant ferns, and an array of tropical plants form a living tapestry of natural beauty, completing this enchanting experience.

Your journey continues to the Royal Agricultural Station Inthanon, a research station for winter plants. The station conducts research on flowers, ornamental plants, vegetables, fruits, and highland fisheries. It also plays a crucial role in promoting fundamental development, social development, and forest watershed conservation. The station contributes to the income

generation of hill tribe farmers' families residing in the surrounding villages. As the day draws to a close, you return to Chiang Mai, the vibrant city that has offered you an incredible array of experiences. You transfer to your hotel and stay overnight, reflecting on the wonders of nature and cultural richness you've encountered throughout this amazing family trip.
