DAY 01 Mae Hong Son Arrival / (Hotel)

After arriving at Mae Hong Son Airport, you will be warmly welcomed and assisted with your transfer to the hotel. DAY 02

Mae Hong Son Sightseeing: Long Neck Karen Village / Wat Phra That Doi Kong Mu Temple / Wat Chong Kham and Wat Chong Klang Temples / Su Tong Pe Bamboo Bridge / Ban Rak Thai Chinese Village / Hmong Shan Pa-O Hill Tribe Villages (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

Embark on a captivating journey from Mae Hong Son city to Huai Suea Tao village, where you will encounter the fascinating Padong or Long Neck Karen Hill tribe. Having migrated from Myanmar to settle in Thailand, the Padong people have preserved a unique tradition of adorning their necks with coiled gold rings. Commencing between the ages of 5 and 9, this practice was initially exclusive to Padong women born on Wednesdays and full moon days but later extended to all Padong women. The solid brass hoops, skillfully bending around the neck like coiled springs, symbolize beauty, status, class, and position within the tribe. Wearing these rings also signifies the importance of marriage. The distinct dress of Padong women, coupled with ancient stories explaining the tradition, sets them apart from other hill tribes in Myanmar.

Continue your exploration with a visit to the majestic Wat Phra That Doi Kong Mu. Perched atop Kong Mu Mountain, this sacred temple offers breathtaking views of the tranquil town below, surrounded by rolling hills and lush valleys. The temple complex is home to two historic pagodas: one built in 1860 by Chong Thong Su, a Shan merchant, and the other in 1874 by Phraya Singhanatracha, the first ruler of Mae Hong Son. Each pagoda contributes to the site's cultural and spiritual significance. From this serene hilltop sanctuary, you can immerse yourself in the peaceful atmosphere and pay homage to the revered Buddha images. Next, visit the twin temples of Wat Chong Kham and Wat Chong Klang, located beside a tranquil swamp. These temples exemplify exquisite Burmese-style architecture and house the revered Buddha image, Luang Paw To. Wat Chong Klang, in particular, stands out for its intricate Burmese

wooden carvings and vivid glass paintings that depict scenes from Buddhist history and mythology, offering a glimpse into the region's rich cultural heritage.

Journey to the Su Tong Pe Bridge, Thailand's longest bamboo bridge. Spanning over 500 meters, this remarkable structure connects Suan Tham Phusama Temple with Kung Mai Sak village. A masterpiece of local craftsmanship, the bamboo bridge offers panoramic views of rice paddies and tranquil canals, showcasing the ingenuity and artistry of the region's artisans. The bridge is especially captivating during the rainy season, when golden rice fields, lush greenery, and distant mountains form a picturesque backdrop. Farmers tending to their fields add a touch of authentic rural charm, while the gentle sway of the bamboo and the soft rustle of leaves create a soothing, meditative ambiance. Each season reveals its own distinct beauty: earthy tones and rustic warmth in the dry season, and glistening golden fields under bright winter skies. No matter the time of year, the Su Tong Pe Bridge offers a unique and unforgettable experience, blending natural beauty with cultural heritage in perfect harmony.

Your journey continue to the enchanting village of Ban Rak Thai. Nestled amid breathtaking mountain scenery, this picturesque settlement embodies its rich Yunnanese heritage, brought by former members of the Chinese Nationalist 93rd Division who sought refuge in this remote area during the 20th century. Their enduring cultural traditions and culinary expertise have shaped Ban Rak Thai into a unique and vibrant enclave. The village's idyllic setting, with its serene lakes, colorful foliage, and mist-shrouded mountains, creates an almost otherworldly charm. Wander through narrow lanes adorned with traditional Yunnanese architecture, showcasing intricate carvings and vibrant details. The gentle pace of daily life here harmoniously blends ancient traditions with modern touches, offering a captivating glimpse into this cultural haven. A highlight of your visit is the opportunity to savor authentic Yunnanese cuisine. Despite distinct cultural traditions, these three tribes have established a peaceful coexistence. Engaging primarily in agriculture and animal husbandry, their farming endeavors focus on cultivating crops such as cabbage, tomatoes, rice, and beans. The majority of their produce finds its way to city markets. Nestled on the hillsides amidst lush forests and stunning natural surroundings, the villages exude a tranquil charm. The uncomplicated way of life, coupled with the unique cultural practices and beautiful traditions of each tribe, creates an enchanting atmosphere. Visitors are warmly welcomed by the friendly locals, leaving an indelible impression on those who journey through. Embark on a captivating journey from Mae Hong Son to Pang Mapha District along Highway No. 1095, navigating a steep and winding road that offers stunning scenery on both sides. This route is renowned for its dramatic landscapes, making the journey itself an adventure. Along the way, make a stop at the Ban Luk Khao Lam viewpoint, a favorite among travelers. Here, you'll be immersed in panoramic views of mountains that stretch out in complex waves as far as the eye can see. During the rainy season or winter, this viewpoint is particularly enchanting, with fog floating in the valleys. The white mist contrasting with the lush green forest creates a mesmerizing scene, enhancing the natural beauty of the landscape. In addition to the breathtaking views, you'll have the opportunity to experience a simple roadside market run by the Lahu hill tribe people. This market is a delightful stop where you can explore and purchase unique local products. The Lahu people are known for their beautiful hand-woven fabrics, each piece showcasing intricate patterns and vibrant colors. These textiles make for wonderful souvenirs and are a testament to the artisans' skill and cultural heritage. Additionally, the market offers a variety of agricultural products, allowing you to sample fresh, locally sourced fruits and vegetables. This viewpoint not only offers scenic beauty but also a cultural immersion, providing a rich and varied experience that highlights both the natural and cultural treasures of the region.

From the Ban Luk Khao Lam viewpoint, continue your journey to Tham Lod Cave, a site of immense archaeological and natural significance. the stunning scenery, and perhaps even enjoy a boat ride to fully appreciate the lake's beauty.

Upon reaching Mueang Phrae District, your first stop is Wat Pong Sunan. This temple boasts a large golden reclining Buddha, situated near an auspicious archway. Inside the ubosot, you'll find the revered Buddha image "Phra Chao Saen Suk," over 500 years old, housed within a pagoda containing relics of Lord Buddha. Noteworthy is the "Phra That Chedi Wiharn Kaew," a white temple with 108 pagodas encircled by a wall of 108 plexiglass balls. This unique feature allows visitors to marvel at the beautifully inverted reflection of the pagodas. Inside the viharn, a large Buddha image named "Phra Saraswadee Prathanpon" is enshrined, accompanied by murals depicting Buddha images in Phrae province and various zodiac years.

Supported by solid wood logs, the building stands gracefully adorned with fretwork and intricately carved patterns. With 72 windows and doors, the structure showcases a Pan-Yah style roof with a rectangular porch and intricately carved fretwork patterns. The house offers a glimpse into the opulent lifestyle of the Lanna nobility and their architectural ingenuity. Explore the well-preserved rooms, admire the antique furniture and artifacts, and learn about the history and cultural significance of this magnificent residence.

Conclude your day with a visit to Phae Mueang Phi, also known as the Ghost Pillars, a natural wonder in the form of soil and sandstone eroded into striking shapes. Designated as a forest park in 1981, Phae Mueang Phi offers a geological spectacle with cliffs and peculiarly shaped clay pillars. The park features a nature trail allowing tourists to explore the forest's geological features and gain a deeper understanding of this unique landscape.
